A voice... a call!

God never ceases to call us to participate in his life and plan. His calls are numerous and varied. To hear them, we must listen, be silent and spend time alone with him.

**LISTEN:** A person, a book, an event can touch us internally. God goes through various ways to call us to be attached to him and to live in his intimacy. Going back over our experiences, reviewing people's encounters, listening to the inner voice can make us realize that a call comes to us and invites us. It is a learning of the heart, as was the case for young Samuel.(1st reading)

**SILENCE:** If his call can be heard everywhere and at any hour, it is above all in the midst of silence that the word of the Lord comes. Listening is therefore the primary activity. The first place, I might say, is it not a heart that is silent? It is where we can welcome him, meet him. It is therefore important to learn to create moments of inner silence during our days in order to be able to hear the voice of the Lord and to develop a relationship with him in prayer.

**SPEND TIME ALONE WITH HIM:** To know the Lord, we must spend time with Him. To know him, to meet him, we must take time with him, as did Andrew and his companion. I know a person who, by rocking in his living room and wondering what God wanted from her, made an extraordinary encounter with the Lord through his Holy Spirit who changed his life. Let us not forget that we cannot bear fruit unless we are attached to the vine (cf. John 15:4)
